Good afternoon St Peter's Community,

This week our Year 3 and 4 students celebrated their first Reconciliation. Due to COVID restrictions each student was only able to bring one adult to the sacrament. I thank our families for their understanding and support during this difficult time of restrictions.

Congratulations to the students involved in the sacrament. We are grateful to Fr Anh and Fr Nathan for leading our students through this journey of forgiveness.

Thank you to the teachers Mrs Christine Moore, Miss Sophie Chepanidis and Miss Jemma Lockyer and our Education and Faith Leader, Mrs Sara Brundell for their guidance and preparation of the students.

Reconciliation

Reconciliation (officially called the Sacrament of Penance, and also known as Confession) is a Sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in his love and mercy to offer us forgiveness for the times we have sinned and turned away from God. At the same time, we are reconciled with the Church because it is also wounded by our sins.

Every time we sin, we hurt ourselves, other people and God. In Reconciliation, we acknowledge our sins before God and the Church. We express our sorrow in a meaningful way, receive the forgiveness of Christ and his Church, make reparation for what we have done, and resolve to do better in the future.

The forgiveness of sins involves four parts:

Contrition: A sincere sorrow for having offended God, and a firm resolve not to repeat our sin. **Confession**: Confronting our sins in a profound way to God by speaking them aloud to the priest.

Penance: An important part of our healing is the penance the priest gives us in reparation for our sins.

Absolution: The priest speaks the words by which we are reconciled to God and are absolved from our sins.

Confirmation

The students from our 3 parish schools will be celebrating the sacrament of Confirmation over two weekends: Saturday 14th of August and Saturday 21st of August, 2021.

These liturgies will be approximately 30 minutes in length and will be held at St Mary of the Cross MacKillop Primary School, 47 Farmhouse Boulevard, Epping North in their sacred space. Each student has been given their allocated liturgy time. A reminder that all Confirmation Candidate Cards need to be returned to school this Friday.





Yesterday the Year 6's that are being confirmed visited the church to meet Bishop Terry Curtin, He assisted the students understand what they will do at confirmation and told the students some funny experiences that he has had before. He also discussed the fruits and the gifts of the Holy Spirit. He explained the role of the sponsor.

Due to COVID -19 restrictions we have restricted the number of people attending. Each student is able to attend the day with their sponsor and two adults. This year 2020 and 2021 students will be involved in the sacrament with Bishop Terry Curtin, Fr Anh and Fr. Nathan.

Thank you to the senior teachers Mrs Jane Molinaro, Miss Grace Condidorio and Miss Emma Perri and our Education and Faith Leader Mrs Sara Brundell for preparing our students this year.

Unfortunately due to COVID restrictions we have had to restrict the number of staff attending the Confirmation sacrament. The Principal, Leadership Team and Year 5/6 teachers and other teachers traditionally attend all the celebrations. This year only three staff can attend each celebration for the purpose of assisting with the ceremony. We are sorry we can not be at all celebrations to support our students and families.

Thank you to our families for your support and understanding as we celebrate the sacraments with our students.



Coulstock Street

Thank you to the parents that are staggering their pick up time in the evening and reducing the amount of traffic at pick up. We have a number of teachers that support and supervise our students in the evening to ensure safety is maximised. Students are supervised until 3.45pm.

No student will be left unattended on the street.

I acknowledge that many of our parents are challenged by the new road rules in Coulstock street; they were introduced as there were serious concerns about student safety and the concerns about traffic congestion and cars blocking the road and roundabout intersection.

Many families have opted to park and walk to the gate to collect their child. Thank you.

I welcome a conversation with our community if you have any questions about the pick up arrangement, however when I am supervising students at pick up time I am unable to give you my full attention. I am sorry. Please call or ring and make an appointment.

It is important that families respect our <u>parent code of conduct policy</u> when discussing school matters.

Unfortunately the school and parish can not appeal traffic infringements.

100 days of Prep

Tomorrow our wonderful Year Prep students will be celebrating 100 days of school. Our terrific Prep Team has planned some exciting activities and the children are invited to dress up in clothes that represent old people. We have two incursions planned for later in the term when restrictions are lifted. We will take photos and post on our facebook page and they can also be accessed on our school website.



Fire Drill

On Tuesday 10th of August the school will conduct a fire drill to ensure our students understand the importance of listening and following the instructions given by the teacher in an emergency situation. All students will be briefed prior to the drill.

Friday 27th August: School Closure

On this day all our staff will be involved in Professional Learning : Restorative Practice.

We are taking a whole school approach - all staff will be trained in the language and practice.

Restorative practice seeks to repair relationships.

Restorative practice is a strategy that seeks to repair relationships that have been damaged, including those damaged through bullying. It does this by bringing about a sense of remorse and restorative action on the part of the offender and forgiveness by the victim.

The rationale behind this approach is that when offenders reflect upon their harm to victims:

- They become remorseful and act restoratively.
- Practitioners can focus on the unacceptable behaviour of offenders rather than their moral character.
- This can lead to healthier interpersonal relations among members of the school community and more effective learning.

<u>There will be no school on Friday 27th August - school will be closed.</u> <u>Teachers will be training in the skills of Restorative Practice.</u>

<u>Lolly Pops</u>: We kindly ask that students do not come to school with lollipops. It can be a choking hazard if children are running with a lollipop in their mouth or if the child falls and slips this could be a serious mouth injury due to the stick. Please keep this treat as a home experience.

STEM opportunity at St. Peter's


I am so happy to announce that ST. Peter's has been recognised by Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) for the new way that we are embedding Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) into the curriculum. We have been invited into a research project, partnering with Monash university which aims to build teacher knowledge and practice for problem-based learning (PBL) within a STEM education context.

Over the next couple of years, the research project will engage our senior teachers and STEM leaders in professional learning regarding PBL in STEM. They will then design and facilitate PBL experiences for their senior students. The intended outcomes from this research project is to build teaching practice within STEM curriculum, as well as enhancing student engagement and motivation to continue to learn STEM content beyond the classroom.

This is a really wonderful opportunity for St. Peter's and we thank MACS and Monash University for the privilege of being included.

Feast of St Mary Mackillop

This Sunday the Church celebrates the feast of St Mary of McKillop, Australia's first saint.

Mary MacKillop was born on january 15th 1842 in Brunswick, Melbourne. She was the eldest of 8 children and was educated by her father.

From the age of 16, Mary Supported her family by working as a clerk, a governess and as a teacher. During this time she met Father Julian Tenison Woods, who needed help in teaching children in the outback about religious education.

In 1866 they both opened the first St Joseph's School in a stable in Penola. On March 19th, the Feast of St Joseph, Mary wore a simple black dress and was known as May, Sister of St Joseph. From here the Congregation of the Sisters of St Joseph had begun. She officially took her vows and became a nun, Mary of the Cross, on August 15th 1867.

Mary MacKillop opened orphanages and homes to care for the homeless. She spent her life caring and hoping to give people a fresh start in life. She died on August 8th 1909.

Please be with me when times are hard or when I am afraid. Please help me to love you just as she loved you.


